As stated by memorandum from A. David Robinson, Chief of Corrections Operations, effective October 16, 2021, food commissary prices will increase a sizable 4.4% for the

increased population. The memo states, "While unfortunate, these price increases are necessary to offset increases in manufacturing and packaging costs while minimally impacting pricing to the inmate population." Minimally? Are they serious? That is a huge difference!

As if it were not expensive enough, for those incarcerated who depend on their mess hall job earnings to support themselves financially, how will they survive? What are we to do? What can we do if the kitchen is infested with cockroaches and we are afraid to eat the food but cannot afford to purchase food from the commissary? Starve?

There are other necessities one must have to exist comfortably within these walls amidst all of the other

discomforts. And for this, one needs money; especially if a person has a lengthy sentence to serve out. If not, spending unnecessary funds on prison luxuries is not recommended.
